

2 cups all-purpose flour ½ cup powdered sugar 1 cup unsalted butter 2 cups chopped pecans

INGREDIENTS

¾ cup dried cherries ¾ cup brown sugar

¾ cup honey

34 cup cream

INSTRUCTIONS

CHERRY PECAN BARS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9 x 13-inch baking pan. Mix flour and powered sugar and divide butter into smaller pieces and add it to the mixture.

Press dough into baking pan.


Bake 20 minutes until golden brown. In medium saucepan, mix pecans, cherries brown sugar, honey,

and cream. Bring to a boil for two minutes. Pour mixture over crust and bake approximately 15 minutes until

a light caramel color and bubbly.

Cool and cut into 24 bars. Enjoy!


