



Agriculture is the process of producing food, feed, and fiber by farming certain domesticated plants and raising animals. Learn about each of these crops as you make your way through the maze of Texas.



Sorghum (pronounced sore-gum) is a type of grass that is mainly used for livestock feed (hogs, poultry, and cattle), and for flour in the U.S.

A staple crop that has many uses clothing, livestock feed, and plastic to name a few! Did you know that one bale of cotton can make 215 pairs of jeans?

Known for its seed, which is used to make cereal grain, wheat is a type of grass. One bushel of wheat weighs 60
