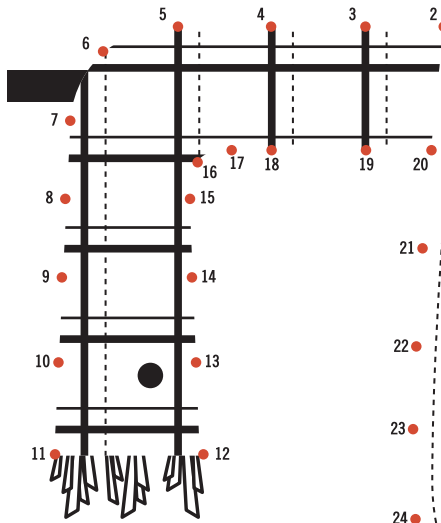
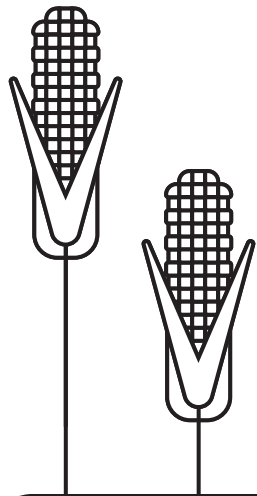
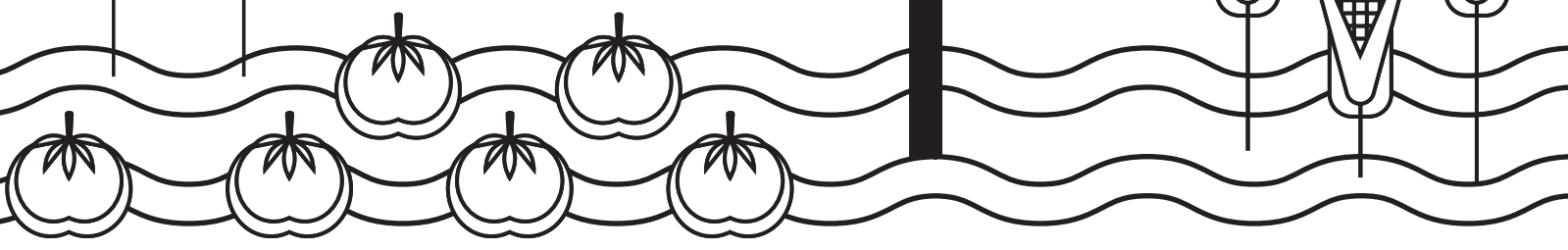
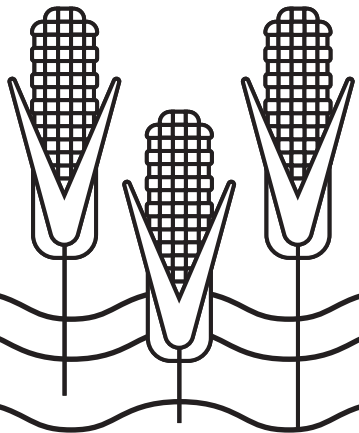
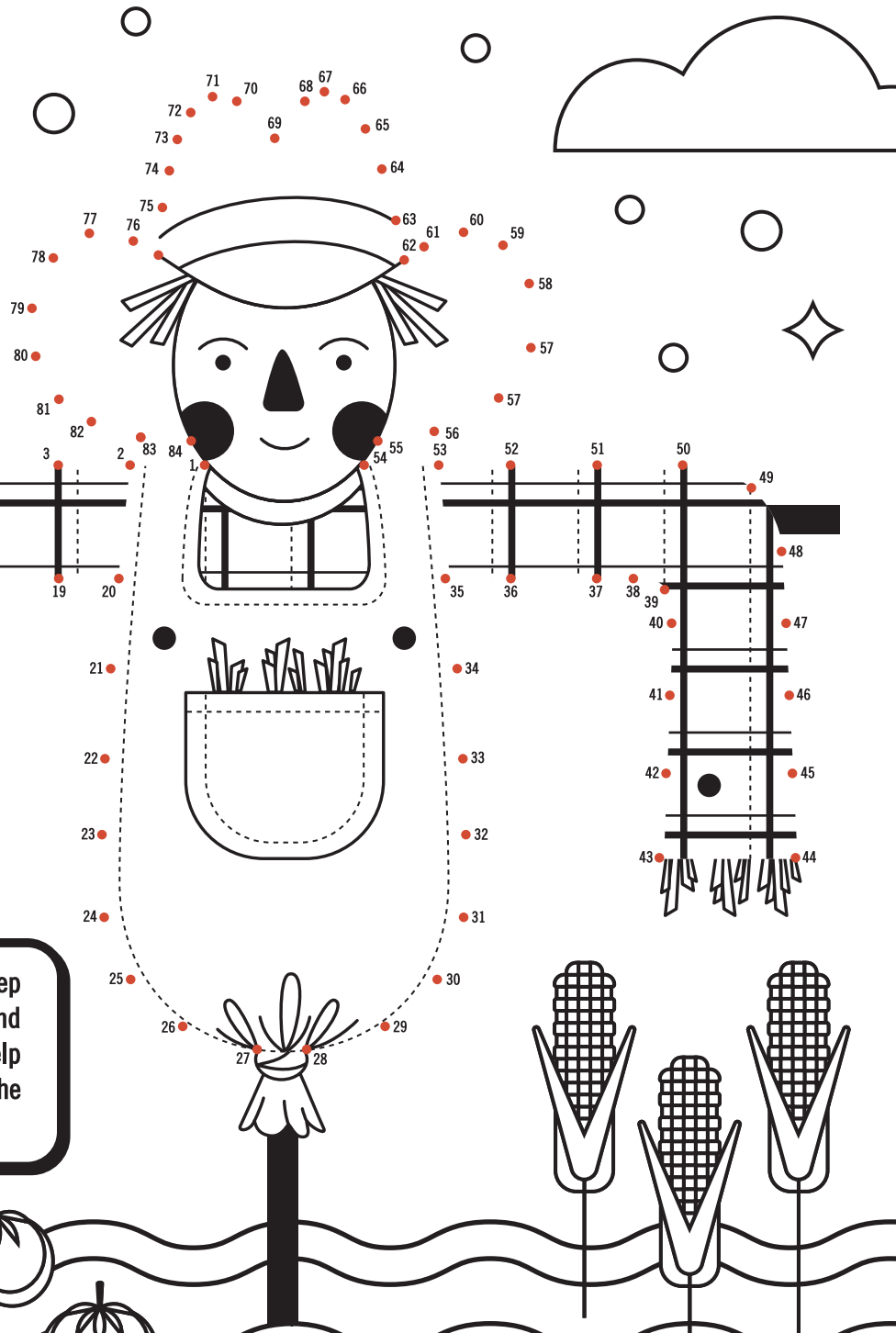


CONNECT THE DOTS

TIC TAC TOE

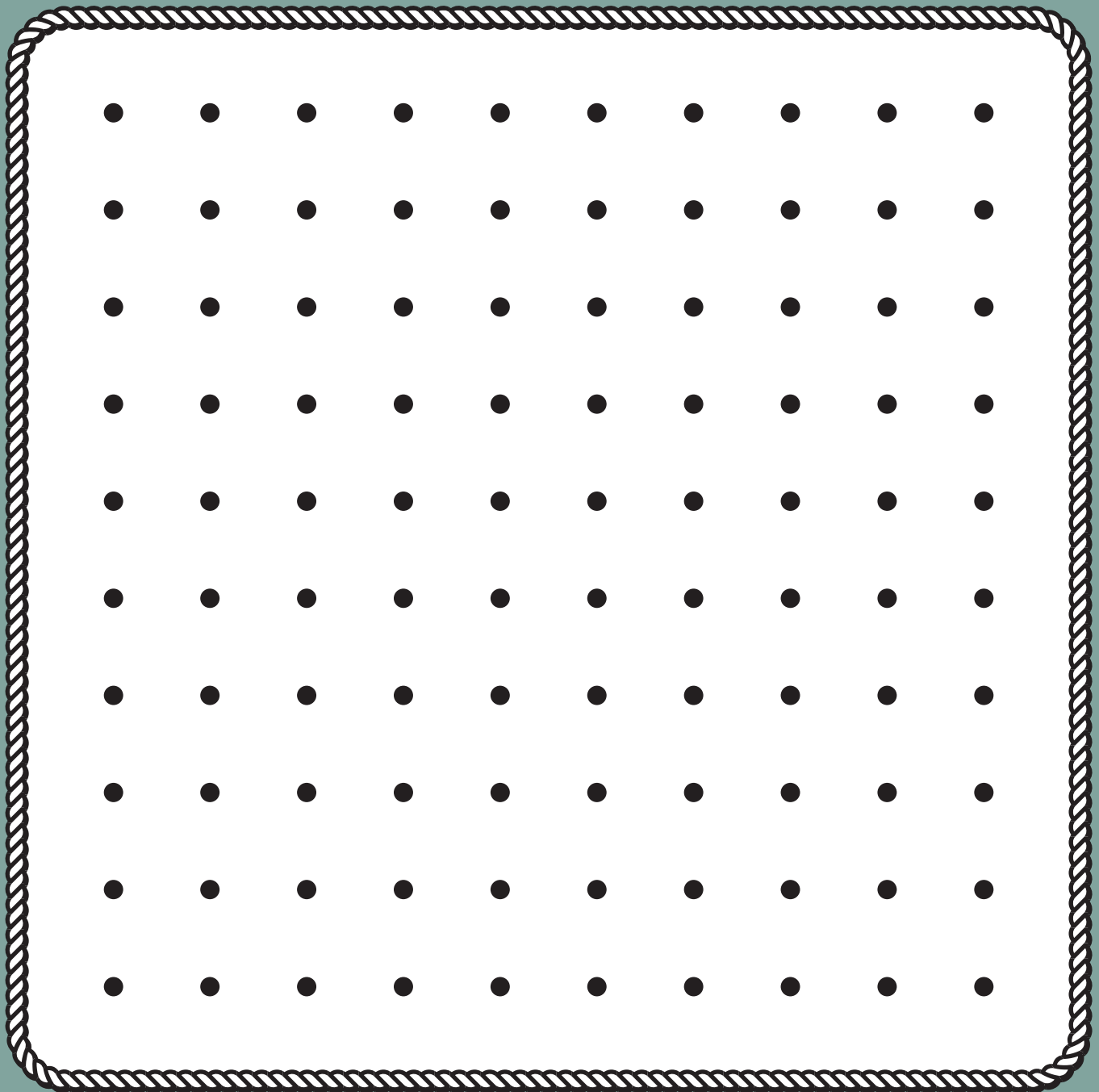


BOX GAME

A very useful and varied crop, corn has more than 4,200 uses. For example, there is corn in hand soap, glue, and even nail polish!

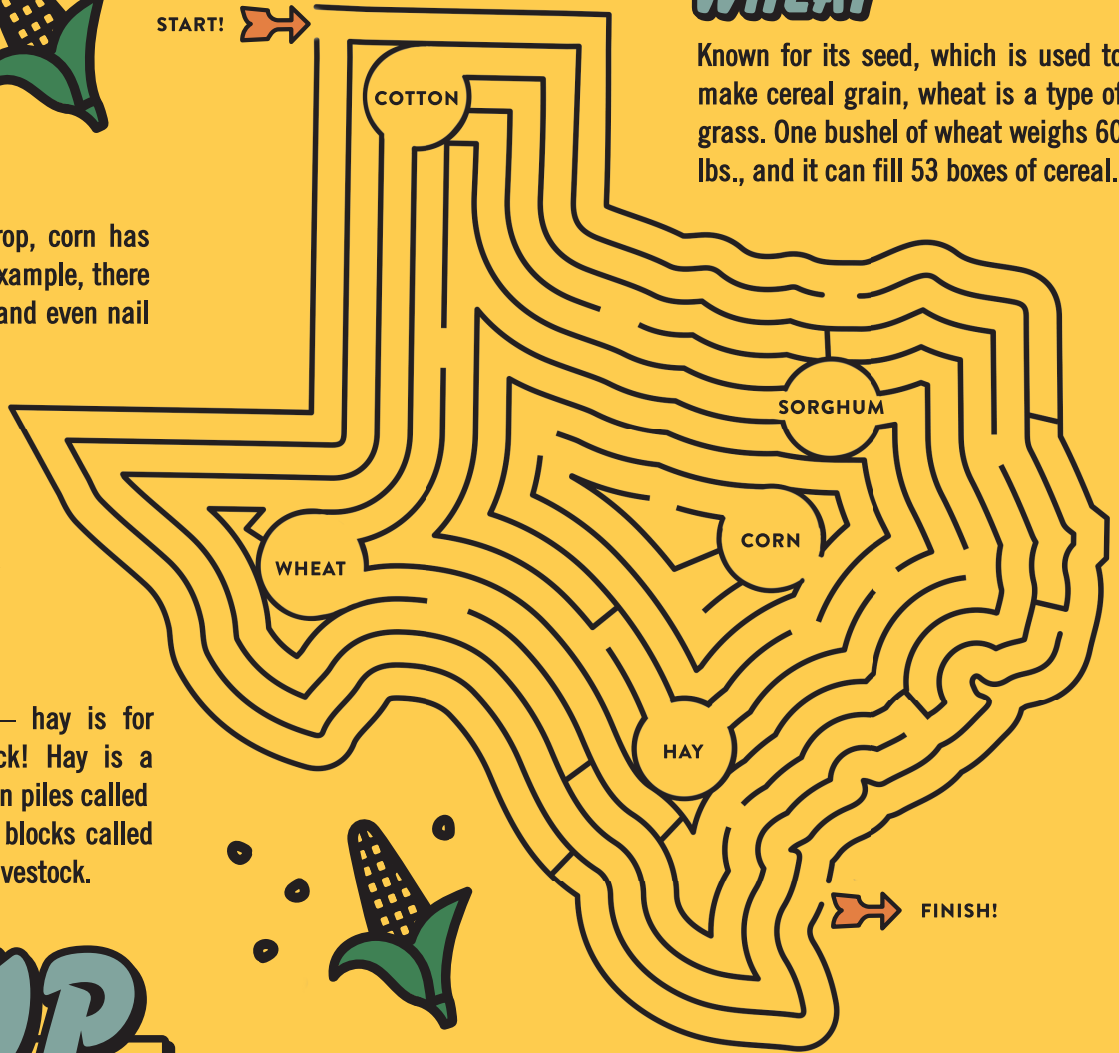
WHEAT

HAY

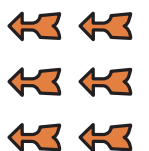
